Storm Drain Markers

Storm drain markers are used to remind residents not to dump hazardous materials into stormwater drainage structures that lead to our local streams.



Help To Prevent Stormwater Pollution

Marking stormwater drains makes people aware that anything that enters a storm drain flows untreated into a nearby stream and river. Litter and harmful chemicals that are dumped into stormwater structures can cause serious problems. Litter can clog storm drains and cause localized flooding; while dumping yard clippings, motor oil, or other contaminants down storm drains can have detrimental effects on water quality.

Labeling Storm Drains is Easy

The storm drain marking program is organized by the Peach County Stormwater Program. Kits are available for local organizations and civic groups and include: tubes of glue, storm drain markers, gloves, and cleaning rags. Prior to being given the kit, a 30 minute training and safety meeting will be held. Each event will also be supervised by a local stormwater representative.
